## The Watershed Approach

- Is community-based and communitydriven
- Relies on local leadership

- Strives for consensus, and avoids litigation as a conservation strategy

## 2022 MWCC Impacts The Watershed Fund

- \$160,000 awarded to 34 local conservation organizations
- 24 miles of stream and lakeshore improved
- 79 conservation practices implemented
- 570 acres made more resilient
- 4,572 community partners engaged



## 2022 MWCC Impacts Events, Trainings, and Workshops

- WaterSMART Grants Workshop with the Bureau of Reclamation
- Communications and Fundraising Workshop with Future West
- MWCC Annual Meeting Virtual

## 2022 MWCC Network Impacts

- \$4.6 Million Invested in Conservation Projects
- 471 Miles of Stream and Lakeshore Improved
- 1,258 Conservation Practices Implemented
- > 24,108 Acres Made More Resilient
- 15,372 Community Partners Engaged
